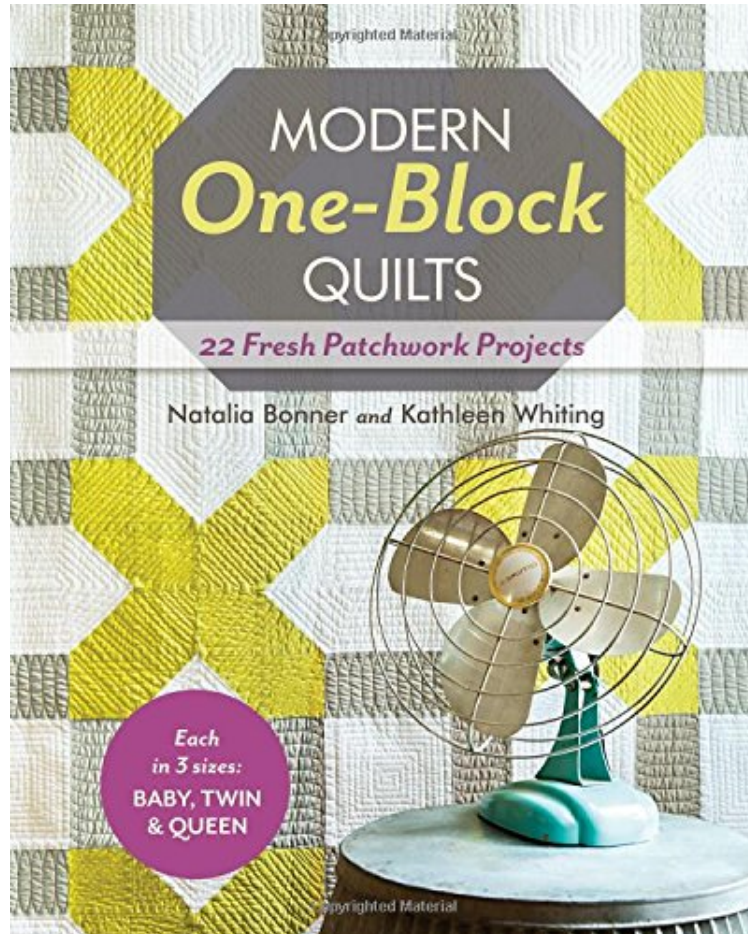

Very little "shortcut" help in the instructions. The instructions say cut 121 squares from fabric Z. You will not get "Cut 12 - 4.5" strips from fabric Z. Subcut into 121 4.5" squares." The math is not difficult to do yourself, it just makes for a little bit more work. 2. Pay attention to block size to determine difficulty of the quilt and time requirements.
