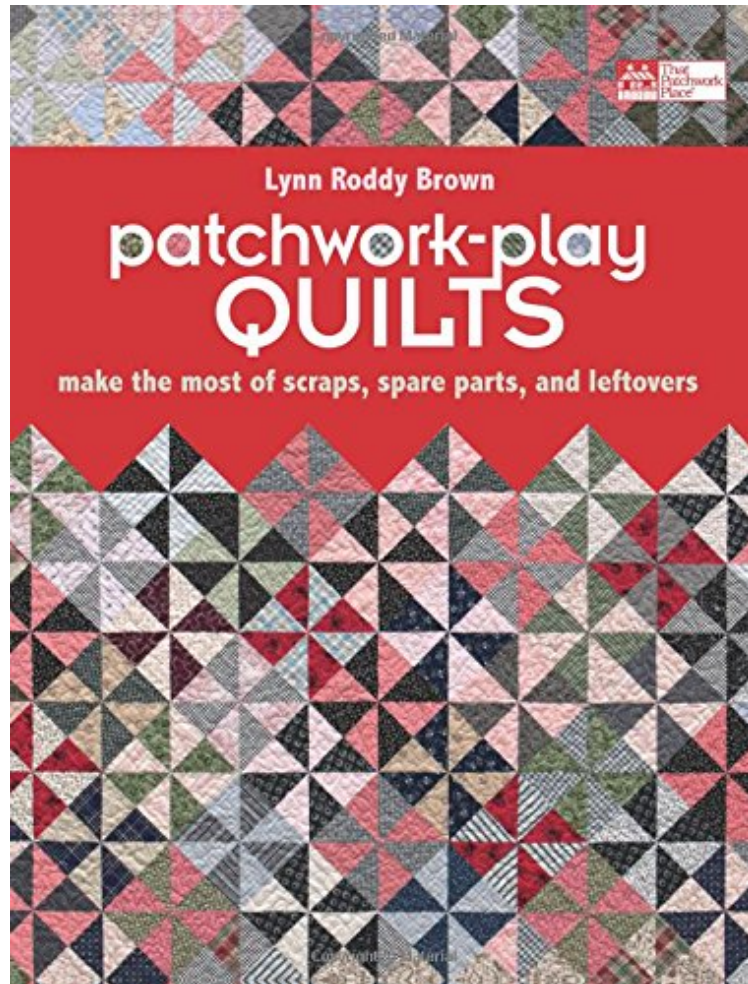

There are seventeen projects, billed as "pre-cut" friendly, which are organized by the type of unit used from half-square triangles and quarter-square triangles to four-patch units and nine-patch units. Having spent over 20 years playing with scrappy quilts, Lynn shares some invaluable tips on what colors you need in your stash to get the best effect (don't shy away from buying lights!), why it's OK to take a break from a quilt until the right color solution becomes apparent and why it's absolutely fine to have a large fabric stash.
